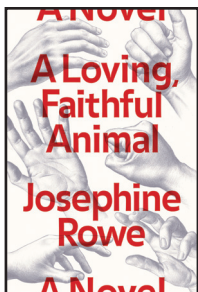


The Truth Has Changed

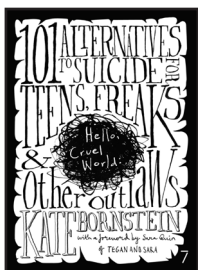

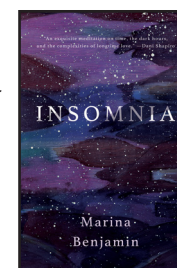
