ESMÉ WEIJUN WANG WINS GRAYWOLF PRESS NONFICTION PRIZE

July 6, 2016—The Collected Schizophrenias by **Esmé Weijun Wang** has been chosen as the newest winner of the Graywolf Press Nonfiction Prize. The book was selected from hundreds of manuscripts by Graywolf editors and judge Brigid Hughes of *A Public Space*. In addition to publication, the prize comes with a \$12,000 advance.

Wang's brilliant essays in *The Collected Schizophrenias* address the disease from the perspective of one who has first-hand experience. Wang cogently and powerfully breaks open the social, historical, medical, and spiritual aspects of schizophrenia as she tackles everything from Andrew Solomon's *Far from the Tree* and the murder of Malcoum Tate, to how genetics informed her choice to remain childless and her fashionsense as a "high-functioning" individual, and does it all in poised and effortless prose.

"As a writer and essayist, I've been slowly building a reputation as someone who writes about mental illness, and particularly schizophrenia, with my eye on ultimately creating a cohesive collection about living with a psychotic disorder," Wang said. "To say that I'm happy about my essay collection finding a home with Graywolf is a vast understatement; Graywolf's literary reputation, particularly as a publisher of quality nonfiction, is one that I'm thoroughly proud to have backing *The Collected Schizophrenias*."

"In these remarkable essays, Esmé Wang writes not with the distance of an observer but from experience to challenge the common narratives about schizophrenia," said judge **Brigid Hughes**. "Combining research and reportage with the personal to make the abstract palpably real, she is a generous and deeply intelligent guide through the complexities of illness and understanding of the self. I'm thrilled to see *The Collected Schizophrenias* receive the Graywolf Nonfiction Prize and join other daringly ambitious books like Leslie Jamison's *The Empathy Exams* and Eula Biss's *Notes from No Man's Land* on the list."

The Graywolf Press Nonfiction Prize is designed to honor and encourage the art of literary nonfiction, and is given to an outstanding manuscript by a writer not yet established in the genre. The forthcoming prizewinner, *Riverine: A Memoir from Anywhere but Here* by Angela Palm will be published in August. The previous winner *Leaving Orbit: Notes from the Last Days of American Spaceflight* by Margaret Lazarus Dean was a *New York Times* Best of 2015 selection by critic Michiko Kakutani. Additional previous winners of the prize include Leslie Jamison, Eula Biss, Kevin Young, Ander Monson, and others.
