"FESTIVAL NEUE LITERATUR 2015" LINE-UP ANNOUNCED

This February, Adam Haslett and Tiphanie Yanique participate in panels and readings with six authors from Austria, Germany, and Switzerland

New York, January 2015 - Festival Neue Literatur, New York's only annual German-language literary festival held in English, will take place from February 19–22, 2015, at venues throughout New York City. This will be the sixth installment of Festival Neue Literatur, where New York City once again plays host to six authors from Austria, Germany, and Switzerland. These authors are rising stars in the Germanlanguage world—but their oeuvre still remains to be discovered by U.S. readers.

The 2015 Festival features the following authors: Marjana Gaponenko and Anna Weidenholzer (Austria), Navid Kermani and Matthias Nawrat (Germany), Jonas Lüscher and Monique Schwitter (Switzerland), and Adam Haslett and Tiphanie Yanique (United States).

The theme of the 2015 festival, which was curated by eminent translator and writer **Tess Lewis**, is **Love and Money**. Half of this year's featured authors explore the seven types of love as defined by the ancient Greeks, as well as their flip sides and the spaces in between. The books illustrate a wide variety of characters and types of love, from first teenage infatuation to an elderly ornithologist whose first and only love was for birds to a family that encounters emotional struggles within itself. When it comes to taboos, however, money often trumps love. The other half of this year's featured authors tackle the delicate issue of money with a sharp, satirical eye. These books examine the less visible ways financial crises warp personal lives and the social fabric, and tell the stories of English bankers stranded in a Tunisian resort, a family living in a dystopian Black Forest, and a middle-aged woman who struggles to maintain her dignity after being declared redundant.

Every winter, the festival pairs the six visiting authors with two U.S. authors, who bring an American perspective and sensibility to these events, creating a dynamic of literary exchange and discourse. The 2015 festival will proudly feature two celebrated American writers, the novelist and short story writer **Adam Haslett**, and Carribean-born fiction writer, poet and essayist **Tiphanie Yanique**. Former U.S. guests have included Keith Gessen, Francine Prose, Joseph O'Neill, and Joshua Ferris, among others.

The **Friedrich Ulfers Prize**, which was awarded for the first time in 2013, will be presented at the festival's exclusive opening ceremony to **Robert Weil**, Editor-in-Chief and Publishing Director at Liveright, a division of W. W. Norton & Company. The prize is endowed with a \$5,000 grant and honors a publisher, writer, critic, translator, or scholar who has championed the advancement of German-language literature in the United States.

The celebrated and widely-translated Vietnamese-American novelist **Monique Truong** will be the Chair of Festival Neue Literatur 2015. "Writers or rather our works begin the conversations about the difficult,

unanswerable subjects of life, and often our works keep the conversations going when everyone else would rather forget. We are the antidote to bread and circuses," she states. The festival extends an invitation to New York audiences to discover singular voices from across Europe and the United States in readings and discussions in Manhattan and Brooklyn.

Each year, the festival also produces a **reader** featuring excerpts from the authors' books. The 2015 reader will be available for download in an electronic version on the festival website at www.festivalneueliteratur.org.

Admission to all FNL events is free, though RSVPs are required due to limited seating.
